


I, Randolph Wayne Strickland, Sr. continue to have the great honor of serving as Commander of VFW Post 7308 Pleasant Prairie Memorial Post for the year 2012 – 2013. As a retired United States Navy Master Chief Petty Officer, I am proud to continue serving in any and all capacities that prove to assist my fellow Veterans.

In all of my years in the US Navy, I tried to build teamwork, camaraderie and long term friendships with all those I served with. It is my intention to carry that over into my present relationships with all my Comrades in Post 7308, District 1, and the Department of WI VFW.

I started my Navy career when I enlisted under the US Navy Delayed Entry Program in December 1970 and reported for active duty in July 1971.

My career started rather rocky at first, serving with COMNAVFORV in South Vietnam and then follow on duty stations aboard USS El Paso (LKA-117); USS Nimitz (CVAN-68); USS Mitscher (DDG-35); USS Seattle (AOE-3); USS Savannah (AOR-4); USS Pharris (FF-1094); Multi-National Peacekeeping Forces – Beirut Lebanon; COMDESRON Ten Staff; and finally, as the Main Propulsion Assistant at the Peter Tomich 1200 PSI Steam Plant, Service School Command, Great Lakes, IL. Where, on 31 July 1991, I retired after more than 20 years of service.

Following my retirement, I went to work as an Engineering Technician and then Project Engineer for Abbott Laboratories in North Chicago, IL. After 17 years with Abbott, I retired and began a new stage in my life, which led me to becoming an Engineering Consultant and allows me to use my free time to continue to do what I love most, helping Veterans that are less



fortunate than myself. The VFW has become my conduit towards completing that goal.

It is my hope and fervent wish that not only can I continue to serve in this capacity, but in so doing advance the cause of the Veterans of Foreign Wars!

The table cloth is white... it symbolizes the purity of their intentions to respond to their country's call to arms. Remember. The single rose displayed in a vase reminds us of the families and loved ones of our comrades in arms who keep faith awaiting their return. Remember.

The red ribbon tied so prominently on the vase is reminiscent of the red ribbon worn on the lapel and breasts of thousands who bear witness to their unyielding determination to demand a proper accounting for our missing. Remember. A slice of lemon is on the bread plate... to remind us of their bitter fate. Remember. There is salt upon the bread plate... symbolic of the family's tears as they wait. Remember.

The Bible represents the strength gained through faith to sustain those lost from our country, founded as one nation under God. Remember. The glass is inverted... they cannot toast with us tonight. Remember. The candle is reminiscent of the light of hope

which lives in our hearts to illuminate their way home, away from their captors, to the open arms of a grateful nation. Remember.

The chair is empty... they are not here. Remember. Remember... all of you who served with them and called them comrades, who depended on their might and aid, and relied on them... for surely... they have not forsaken you.

May God forever watch over them and protect them and their families.




Pictured here to the left, is VFW Post 7308 Commander Randy Strickland, preparing for the service. The service was
