Also, I am a member of the Beirut Veterans of America, Navy Club USA WI Squadron as Shipswriter, NCUSA Ship 40 – Kenosha as Senior Executive Officer, USS Nimitz Association, the National Association of Destroyer Sailors, work on the staff of http://navy.togetherweserved.com and I am the present President of the Kenosha County Veterans Council.
